Candidate Information

New York University will be a testing site for the Western Regional Examining Board (WREB). This document is intended to provide necessary information regarding the facility. Questions regarding the content and protocol for the examination should be directed to the WREB office. Questions relating to the facility and available services at NYU please contact the examination School Coordinator Dr. James Kaim, for questions specific to instruments and supplies, (contact information above). NYU welcomes outside candidates on a space available basis.

Candidates must first register with WREB for the examination.

Note: Additional fees apply to candidates not currently enrolled as full-time students at NYU.

Tour

A tour of the facility will be held before the candidate orientation. You will be assigned to either clinic 3 or 5, they are both identical in design.

Please note: You will be working on either clinic floor 3 or 5. You must use the elevators to transport patients from your working clinic to the grading clinic! NO EXCEPTIONS. Grading clinic is on the 4th floor. Patients using the stairs during your examination may result in you being asked to leave the examination. This is a strict liability issue.

Candidates and assistants **WITHOUT** patients may use the stairs.

Provisional Acceptance

New York University does NOT participate in provisional acceptance. All patient submissions will be done at the exam site.

Emergency Protocol

Screening

NYU does **NOT** provide any patient screening services or accommodations for non-NYU enrolled students to utilize any of the clinics for screening of patients. Candidates <u>will be permitted</u> to take radiographs <u>ONLY</u> <u>during the examination</u> should that be necessary but only after a candidate has had a patient rejected or at the request or direction of WREB because of non-diagnostic or missing radiographs. **Please note:** all x-rays during the examination are conventional. Digital is not available.

Patients

New York University College of Dentistry **cannot** provide patients for candidates. <u>Please do not call the school concerning obtaining patients or to ask for confidential patient records</u>. Recruitment of patients is entirely up to the candidate. Some candidates looking for patients in the area may choose to visit community clinics or contact local dentists. It must be made clear that WREB candidates are not acting on the part of NYU and that the arrangements made are private between the candidate and the patient.

"Patient brokering, i.e. the selling of patients, will not be tolerated under any circumstances within the school of dentistry and/or on the premises of the university. Violation of this rule will result in immediate removal from the campus of the university."

In addition, all candidates must complete a patient registration form for all patients that are brought to the college for the WREB examination. This form will be distributed at orientation. You will be required to list the patients' name, address, phone number, your name, WREB ID number and the name, address, and phone number of the licensed dentist responsible for any after care of that patient. This applies to back up patients as well. All patients will be required to sign this form.

Dental Assistants

NYU has no direct access regarding dental assistants. A candidate may refer to possible dental health temp agencies listed in the New York yellow pages. (Refer to *WREB 2019 Dental Candidate Guide* guidelines for Dental Assistants.)

Clinic Equipment

NYU College of Dentistry provides all candidates both NYU and outside candidates with **ALL** instruments needed to perform the required clinical and manikin procedures. These include amalgamators, curing lights, cavitrons, high and low speed handpieces, rotary endodontic instrumentation and the working instruments for restorative, perio and endodontic procedures.

CANDIDATES MAY NOT BRING ANY INSTRUMENTS TO THE EXAM FOR USE IN PATIENT CLINICS.

Candidates found using or in possession of non-NYU instruments IN THE CLINICS will be dismissed from the examination. This is to insure that we maintain strict infection control protocols. **Exception**: you may bring any STERILIZED endodontic OR prosthodontic instruments you may want to use in the sim lab. After use they must be placed into a sealed plastic container. Although we provide filling materials, you are also encouraged to bring your own patient and endodontic filling materials.

Check-in & Grading instrument sets needed by the examiners will also be provided. They will be available to the examiners in the grading clinics. *No instruments will be transported from the working clinics to the grading clinics.* WREB will assign you a specific clinic chair. You will be able to see your clinic unit during the school tour offered as part of orientation. No prior visits to the school are permitted and unauthorized visits will be reported.

Dental units are easily convertible from right to left handed. You will or should have provided that information to WREB. WREB then forwards that information to NYU. Make sure WREB has your information. All units are right-handed unless a candidate has requested a left-handed unit.

Payment for the applicable NYU fee which is separate from your WREB registration fee must be received no later than two (2) weeks prior to the examination orientation. The \$550 fee is mailed to NYU (see below).

Instrument Kits

Every candidate by paying the NYU registration fee will have access to the instrument kits for the different patient and manikin procedures. The restorative kit covers both amalgam and/or composite procedures. You can check out as many kits as necessary but only one kit at a time. Instrument kits will be available on your clinic floor at a central supply desk. Kits are returned to a separate window on the clinic floor. Candidates may NOT keep instrument cassettes overnight. When you return one kit you may check out another kit. Handpieces: both high and low are distributed as a separate kit. Again, you may check out one handpiece kit at a time. You will also have access on the clinic to the Perio kit. An Endo kit and Prosthodontic kit will be distributed from the supply desk on the 11th floor outside the simulation lab where the procedure will be performed.

**Disposable Gowns will be provided to all Candidates and Assistants. It is an NYU requirement that only Disposable Gowns be worn within the clinics and the simulation laboratory during the WREB examination. Gowns may be color coded for dental assistants and dental candidates

The following supplies will be provided in the endodontic lab: developing solution and fixer, cotton pellets, gutta percha master cones .02 and .04 and accessory points, 5 sizes of paper points, root canal sealer, eugenol, alcohol and films. Automatic and Hand Developers will be provided during the Endo Examination. All other supplies and instruments must be provided by the candidate. The WREB endodontics examination will use the ModuPro Endo model #MP_E120_PC. Make certain you are getting the typodont with the magnetic plates. You will need to order this item and bring it with you since the college does not have any to rent. You will also need the entire kit which includes the typodont and individual sextants. You may order these directly from Acadental at www.acadental.com/WREB. NYU does use shrouds on the manikin. Please refer to the WREB 2019 Dental Candidate Guide for further information. Please note: You may bring any Endodontic points, cements or other medicaments that you normally use. These materials may only be brought and used during the Endodontic Procedure.

<u>Simulation Laboratory for Prosthodontic Examination:</u>

The Prosthodontic Kit is a basic instrument kit. All disposables are included. NYU uses disposable burs for the Prosthodontic lab. Reminder you may bring your own burs for the manikin procedures. NOT FOR THE PATIENT PROCEDURES. We also supply impression putty although you could bring your own so that you are working with a material you are comfortable using. This is the list of instruments found in the NYU Fixed Prosthetic Cassette that will be distributed to all candidates who will be taking the Prosthetic section. HOWEVER, as you will see for the simulation clinic and for just preparing the teeth there is not much that is really applicable. Please refer to the WREB 2019 Dental Candidate Guide for model to purchase.

<u>Radiology Supplies and Information</u> - During the examination only conventional radiography will be available. The simulation laboratory uses exclusively conventional x-rays. Conventional x-ray film will be provided along with x-ray mounts. Digital x-rays can NOT be transmitted from outside the college. During the examination starting Friday, March 18 should a candidate require the need for patient x-rays candidates need to be prepared to conventional x-rays. Peri-Pro automatic processors will be available in the clinic as well as in the simulation laboratory.

<u>The Dental Supply Store</u> operated by Schein is located in the sublevel of the dental school. It will be open during the examination on <u>Thursday</u> and <u>Friday</u>, 7am-4pm; <u>closed</u> <u>Saturday</u> and <u>Sunday</u>. Supplies may be pre-ordered at <u>212-545-0959</u>. The supply store can supply the required Endodontic Typodont and/or Prosthodontic Typodonts as required by WREB. Orders must be placed two weeks in advance.

Casting Procedure

NYU does not have facilities for candidates to do their own investment or casting. Laboratory facilities do exist for any candidate to pour impressions however NYU will **NOT** provide any stone.

Sources for Lab Work

NYU does not utilize or support any local laboratories. Candidates needing an outside lab should check the yellow pages.

All lab work must be performed at an outside laboratory. Candidates must make their own arrangements with laboratories. NYU is not responsible for any of the work or services provided by these laboratories.

Parking

The dental school is located on the corner of 24th Street and 1st Avenue. There are no parking facilities offered by NYU. Parking is available at several private facilities within a short distance from the Dental School. However, these parking facilities are first come first serve access. The NYU cafeteria will be open on Thursday and Friday. It will be closed on Saturday and Sunday.

Infection Control Standards

<u>Asepsis</u>: Disinfect surfaces with spray disinfectant (Cavacide) available in each of the clinics. Cover surfaces that may become contaminated with plastic wrap also available in the clinics. Flush air/water syringes for 20-30 seconds between patients.

<u>Hazard Waste Disposal</u>: Place biohazardous waste in red bag containers located in each clinic. Biohazardous waste includes hard and soft tissue, soaked items that would release blood or saliva in a liquid or semi-liquid state if compressed, and items caked with dried blood and capable of releasing these materials when handled. Blood and saliva stained items are not considered biohazardous waste.

<u>Sharps/Amalgam Disposal</u> : Needles, endodontic files, metal retainers and other sharps must be disposed of in the red sharps containers located in each clinic as well as in the simulation. Labeled waste containers for amalgam scraps are located in the operatories.
Standard Precautions: The school requires the use of universal barrier protection during all direct patient contact and during the endodontic simulation exercise. Gloves and face masks will be provided. OSHA required eyewear for candidates and patients will NOT be provided.
