#### Dear Candidate:

The Western Regional Examining Board will be conducted at the Dental Clinics Building, 707 Parnassus Avenue, at the University of California, San Francisco School of Dentistry on May 17 - May 20, 2019. All information regarding the examination procedures, patient requirements and your assigned days will be sent to you directly from the Western Regional Examining Board approximately four weeks prior to the examination. The Candidate Guide provided by the Western Regional Examining Board is very complete and should answer most of your examination questions.

Orientation will be held on Friday, May 17, 2019 in an auditorium that is yet to be determined at the University of California, San Francisco. We will present a tour of the school and demonstrate equipment beginning at 1:30 p.m. and will meet in the first floor lobby area of the Dental Clinics Building. The clinical examinations will be conducted at UCSF School of Dentistry, 707 Parnassus Avenue on May 18 - May 20, 2019.

For the clinical portion of the examination, the UCSF School of Dentistry will provide all expendable and disposable items to the candidates during the examinations (including clinic gowns). The School will provide sterilization services for all candidates during the clinical examination days. The Clinic Infection Control Guidelines of the School follow strict ADA, CDC and Dental Bureau of California guidelines of "universal precautions". These guidelines, including the sterilization of handpieces, must be adhered to during the clinical examinations.

Some dental supplies may be purchased at the Student Store, Room D-1000C, 1st floor, Dental Clinics Building. On the week of May 13 – May 17, the Student Store hours will be 8:30am to 4:00pm. On Saturday, May 18 - Monday, May 20, the WREB Clinical Examination dates, the Student Store will be open 6:00am to 6:00pm. At the Student Store candidates can rent Hi & Low Speed handpieces (\$100 each) and Piezo tip (\$100). A credit card will be held at the Student Store until the rented items have been returned. All other dental instruments must be supplied by the candidate.

Candidates are required to provide their own patients. The School cannot provide or assist in obtaining patients for candidates and cannot provide facilities for screening or examination of patients. No solicitation for patients is permitted in the Dental Clinics Building or in the immediate School of Dentistry campus area. Patient brokering, i.e., the selling of patients, will not be tolerated under any circumstances within the school of

Conventional radiographic facilities are available, but all patient films must be taken by the School's x-ray technicians. Fees for x-ray services must be paid at that time. Please call the UCSF Dental Center at 415-476-1891 for X-ray prices. UCSF is fully digital for the Endo portion of the examination.

The clinics are designed in cubicle form and all clinical units will accommodate four-hole high and low speed handpieces. All clinic units have 3-way air water syringes which utilize disposable tips. We have A-dec chair mounted units and Link doctor and assistant stools. All clinical procedures will be completed on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> floor clinics.

Candidates will be mounting the ModuPro arches (model MPE120) on Frasaco manikin heads. The manikins require an articulator. There will be shrouds used on the manikins. The School Student Store does not carry the Acadental ModuPro arches. They can be purchased from Acadental directly at <a href="https://www.acadental.com/WREB">www.acadental.com/WREB</a> or by calling (913)384-7390.

We will be participating in Provisonal Acceptance this year for UCSF students only. All provisional radiographs must be given to radiology to submit to WREB between April 17 – May 2, 2019.

Food services are available at the Moffitt Hospital Cafeteria on the 2nd floor of Moffitt Hospital, and in the Millberry Union Complex. There are several motels nearby, or a candidate may stay at a downtown hotel which would be a short bus or streetcar ride from the campus. The enclosed map will provide information and familiarization of the immediate surrounding areas of the campus. Candidates may acquaint themselves with the clinics and laboratories of the Dental Clinics Building prior to the WREB Examination. However, we ask that you not disturb students who are providing care for their patients. Please obtain a visitor's name tag from the 1<sup>st</sup> Floor Front Desk of the Dental Clinics Building.


# **CASTING LABORATORY**

# Dental Board of California - Infection Control Regulations

- 1005. Minimum Standards for Infection Control.
  - (A) As used in this section:
    - (1) "Universal precautions" is an approach to infection control according to which all human blood and certain human body fluids are

treated as if known to be infectious for HIV, HBV and other blood-borne pathogens.

- (2) "Critical instruments" are surgical and other instruments used to penetrate soft tissue or bone.
- (3) "Semi-critical instruments" are surgical and other instruments that are not used to penetrate soft tissue or bone, but contact oral tissue.
- (4) "Non-critical instruments and devices" are instruments and devices that contact intact skin.
- (5) "Low-level disinfection" is the least effective disinfection process. It does not kill bacterial spores or mycobacterium tuberculosis var bovis, a laboratory test organism used to classify the strength of disinfectant chemicals.
- (6) "Intermediate-level disinfection" kills mycobacterium tuberculosis var bovis that indicates less resistant organisms such as hepatitis B and HIV are also killed.
- (7) "High-level disinfection" kills some, but not necessarily all bacterial spores. This process kills mycobacterium tuberculosis var bovis, and other bacteria, fungi and viruses.
- (B) Licensees with one or more employees shall comply with infection control precautions mandated by the California Occupational Safety and Health Administration. All licensees shall comply with the following minimum precautions to minimize the transmission of pathogens in health care settings:
  - (1) Universal precautions shall be practiced in the care of all patients.
- Medical exam gloves shall be worn whenever there is potential for contact with blood, blood-contaminated saliva, or mucous membranes. Sterile gloves shall be worn in connection with surgical procedures involving soft tissue or bone. Sterile coolants/irrigants shall be used for surgical procedures involving soft tissue or bone. Sterile coolant/irrigants are deemed to be sterile when delivered using a device or process that has a Food and Drug Administration (FDA) marketing clearance for delivery of sterile coolant/ irrigants to the patient. Delivery of sterile coolant/ irrigants shall be in accordance with the manufacturer's directions.
- (3) Health care workers shall wash hands and put on new gloves before treating each patient. Antimicrobial soap shall be used to wash hands for surgical procedures. Health care workers shall wash hands after removing and discarding gloves after treatment of each patient or before leaving the operatory. Gloves shall not be washed before or after use.
- (4) Health care workers shall wear surgical face masks and either chin length plastic face shields or surgical masks and protective eye-wear when treating patients. After each patient, and during patient treatment if applicable, masks shall be changed if moist or contaminated. After each patient, face shields and protective eyewear shall be cleaned and disinfected, if contaminated.
- (5) Health care workers shall wear reusable or disposable gowns when their clothing is likely to be soiled with blood or other bodily fluids.
  - (6) Protective attire must be removed when leaving the laboratories and work areas.
  - (7) Items or surfaces such as, but not limited to, light handles which are impossible to clean and disinfect, shall be protected with impervious barriers. Between patients, the covering must be removed, discarded and replaced with clean covering.
  - (8) Splash shields shall be used in dental laboratories.
  - (9) Health care workers who have exudative lesions or weeping dermatitis shall refrain from all direct patient care and from handling patient care equipment until the condition resolves.
  - (10) Needles shall be recapped only by using the scoop technique or a mechanical device designed for holding the needle sheath, or a mechanical device which eliminates the need for two handed

- capping. Needles shall not be bent or broken prior to disposal. Disposable needles, syringes, scalpel blades and/or other sharp items and instruments shall be placed into puncture resistant containers for disposal.
- Heat stable critical and semi-critical instruments shall be cleaned and sterilized before use by using steam under pressure (autoclaving), dry heat, or chemical vapor. EPA-registered sterilants/disinfectants shall be used for sterilization of heat-sensitive critical items and for high-level disinfection of heat-sensitive semi-critical items.
- (12) Heavy-duty utility gloves shall be worn to process instruments before sterilization or high-level disinfection.
- (13) Critical and semi-critical instruments shall be packaged before sterilization if they are not to be used immediately.
- Proper functioning of the sterilization cycle shall be verified at least weekly through use of a biological indicator (such as spore test).
- (15) Counter tops and dental unit surfaces shall be cleaned with disposable towels followed by an intermediate-level disinfectant between patients. Low-level disinfectants shall be used for visibly soiled areas such as floors, walls and other housekeeping surfaces.
- (16) Intraoral items such as impressions, bite registrations, prosthetic and orthodontic appliances shall be cleaned and disinfected with an intermediate-level disinfectant before manipulation in the laboratory and before placement in the patient's mouth.
- (17) All high-speed dental handpieces, low-speed handpiece components used intraorally, and other dental unit attachments such as reusable air/water syringe tips and ultrasonic scaler tips shall be heat-sterilized between uses.
  - (18) Anti-retraction devices in dental unit water lines shall be installed and maintained.
  - (19) The dental unit line shall be flushed between each patient.
  - (20) Single-use disposable instruments (e.g. prophylaxis, angles, prophylaxis cups and brushes, tips for high-speed evacuators, saliva ejectors, air/water syringe tips) shall be used for one patient only and discarded appropriately.
  - (21) At the beginning of each workday, dental unit lines shall be purged with air or flushed with water for at least two(2) minutes prior to attaching handpieces, scalers and other devices.
  - (22) Contaminated solid waste shall be disposed of according to applicable local, state and federal environmental standards.
  - (23) A written protocol shall be developed for proper instrument processing, operatory cleanliness, and management of injuries.
  - (C) A copy of this regulation shall be conspicuously posted in each dental office
  - (D) The Board shall review this regulation annually.

#### **Brief Overview of UCSF School of Dentistry**

#### **Infection Control Guidelines**

- Universal Precautions will be observed at this facility in order to prevent contact with blood or Other
  Potentially Infectious Materials (OPIM). All human blood and certain human body fluids (saliva in
  dentistry) are treated as if they are known to be infectious for HIV, HBV and other bloodborne pathogens.
  Universal precautions means that the same infection control procedures are used for all patients and with
  all specimens. Treat all patients as if they were infectious.
- 2. Hand Injury Prevention -
  - A. Precautions should be taken to avoid hand injuries during all procedures.
  - B. Handwashing should occur before placing gloves. Students and staff must also wash hands and any other potentially contaminated skin area with soap and water immediately after removing gloves or as soon as feasible.
  - C. Gloves shall be worn when performing any dental procedure and when handling or touching specimens, contaminated items, or surfaces.
  - D. Single-use disposable gloves used at this facility are to be disposed of after one use (i.e. are not to be washed or decontaminated for re-use), or if they are torn, punctured, or when their ability to function as a barrier is compromised. Utility gloves may be decontaminated for re-use provided that the integrity of the gloves is not compromised.
  - E. Use over-gloves when touching non-sterile or non-disinfected items (e.g. amalgamator), when getting items from inside of mobile cabinet, and whenever leaving the immediate treatment area.
- 3. Eye and Face and Other Protection -
  - A. Masks in combination with eye protection devices, such as goggles or glasses with solid side shield or chin length face shields, are required to be worn whenever splashes, spray splatter or droplets of blood or OPIM may be generated, and eye, nose or mouth contamination can reasonably be anticipated.
  - B. Eyewear or other means of eye protection shall be used by patients during all procedures when chair is reclined.
  - C. Gowns must be worn during all dental procedures. They will be changed when soaked through with blood or OPIM. Gowns are not to be work outside of the clinic treatment areas.

#### 4. Sterilization -

A. All reusable dental instruments including handpieces, must be properly heat sterilized between patients.

#### 5. Decontamination -

- A. The UCSF School of Dentistry clinics must be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. Staff and students must decontaminate any areas, surfaces, or equipment that become contaminated with blood or OPIM, according to the following schedule:
  - a. Patient care areas (operatories, lab areas, x-ray room) will be decontaminated with an appropriate EPA-approved disinfectant immediately after a procedure and the patient has been dismissed or after any spill of blood, or OPIM.
  - b. Before patient treatment spray the following items liberally with disinfectant, wipe with paper towels and spray again, leaving wet for ten minutes; operating light (handles and front plastic cover avoid spraying rounded back reflector surface); air-water syringe, saliva ejector (handle, hose and control); high-volume evacuator (handle, hose and

- control), chair, dental unit surfaces, counter tops, sink faucets, mobile cabinet (top and handles). Electrical switches and controls should be wiped with a disinfectant-saturated paper towel, since spraying may cause electrical short in wiring.
- c. Run water (at full volume) through air-water syringe for one minute.
- d. Place disposable plastic sleeve wrap over operating light handles.
- e. Rinse impressions under gently running water immediately after removal from patient's mouth, spray with disinfectant, and place into zip-lock bag.

#### 6. Disposable Barriers -

A. Wherever possible, disposable, protective barriers will be used on surfaces that are likely to become contaminated during a procedure (e.g. coverings over light handle covers, plastic tubing over air/water syringe handles). Such protective coverings must be replaced between patients or if they have become overtly contaminated during a procedure.

#### 7. Food, Drink and Cosmetics -

A. Where there is a reasonable likelihood of exposure to blood or other potentially infectious materials, students and staff are not to eat, drink, apply cosmetics or lip balm or handle contact lenses. Food and beverages are not to be kept in refrigerators, freezer shelves, cabinets, or on counter or bench tops where blood or other potentially infectious materials are present.

#### 8. Contaminated Needles and Sharps -

- A. Shall not be sheared or purposely broken. Recapping of needles is allowed for procedures requiring more than one administration of anesthesia, but in such cases, a one-handed recapping method is required.
- B. Contaminated sharps shall be discarded immediately or as soon as feasible in containers that are closable, puncture resistant, leak proof on sides and bottom and properly labeled.
- C. In the UCSF Dental Clinics, sharps containers are found at each operatory or are shared by a bank of adjacent operatories.

#### 9. Other Regulated Waste -

A. (e.g. grossly bloody gauze, etc.) shall be placed in containers which are closeable, constructed to contain all contents and prevent leakage of fluids during handling, storage, transportation or shipping.

#### 10. Waste that is not regulated

A. Waster or medical waste, but that is contaminated with small quantities of blood or OPIM (e.g. 2x2 gauze with small amount of blood or saliva) must be placed into an impervious paper or plastic bag, sealed, and disposed in regular trash.
